ATTACKS MODERN REJECTION OF BIBLE

M. A. Howlett Tells Bible Students Many Ministers Ignore Scriptures.

"Any Christian who does not know when Christ his Lord will return is not worthy of the name and is living below his privileges," stated M. A. Howlett to the capacity audience of Bible Students assembled at Hyman Hall yesterday. "The statement that 'no man knoweth' was given by our Lord at the end of his talk to his disciples regarding the evidences of his second presence," he said. "The Master would not spend two hours giving them these details in answer to their query. 'When shall these things be?' and then wind up by saying in effect, 'You cannot know, anyway.'"

"The war between modernists and fundamentalists is revealing what Bible Students have been telling for years, viz., that many ministers have rejected the Bible. It could not be other wise. Did God intend Adam to go to heaven? Not at all. He was given earthly dominion, forfeited through sin. How could Adam go to heaven? He would certainly have to die. Death came because of sin. So we might reason it was necessary to sin to go to heaven. Beyond our own philosophy we have a 'sure word,' which plainly tells us man was created for the earth, and not intended for death. Jesus came, what for? To save what was lost. Heaven was not lost. Many supposed Christians mock, and the Athenians of Acts xviii, when they hear of the resurrection of the dead, and for the same reason. These Athenians believed in the immortality theory, and that man passes to his final reward at death. These theories make futile the Christian's hope of a resurrection from the dead."

Mr. Howlett claimed that the world is approaching the grand climax of the world's troubles, which will complete the overthrow of earth's present rulers, making way for the Prince of Peace. The first work of his kingdom, according to the Scriptures, is that of resurrection of the dead and that would mean that millions now living need not die if willing subjects of that glorious kingdom. Many Bible statements of beautiful truths have been lost to us through lack of continued study. Jesus said: 'This generation (witnessing the signs given) shall not pass till all be fulfilled.' Therefore, we expect some in this audience will witness the resurrection and restoration, beginning with the resurrection of the dead."

States He Is Not Out "Hunting For Votes."

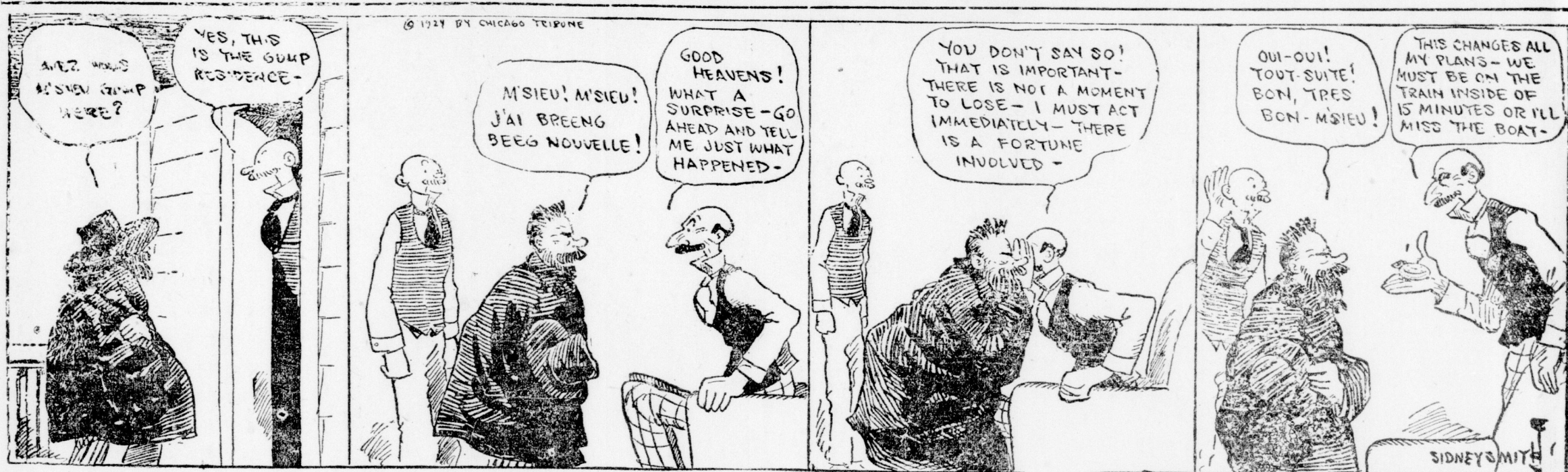
Ald. Gordon Drake, ward three, says he is not "out hunting votes" and there will be no new schools started during 1924, an East London colleague or anything else.

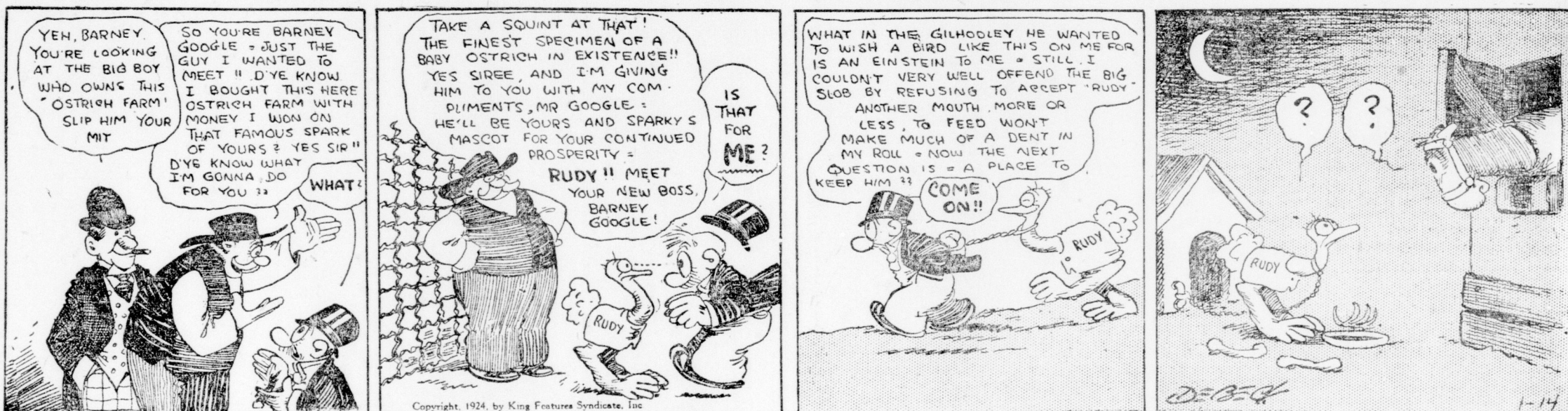

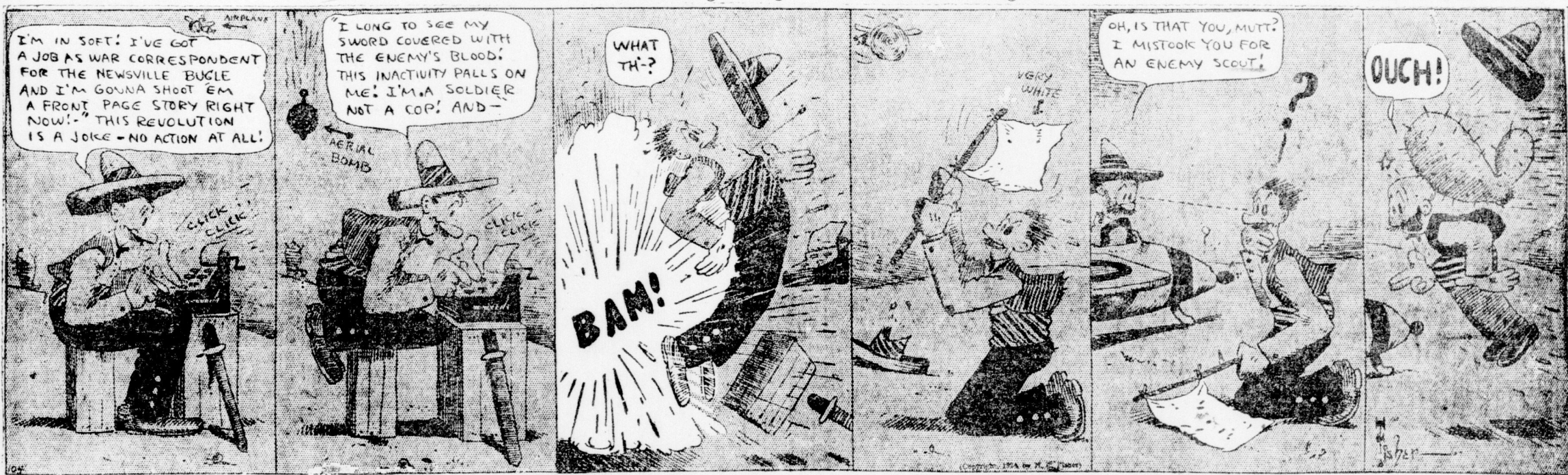
