PIONEER OF LAMBTON COUNTY PASSES AWAY

Thedford, April 26.—John H. Cornell, an old and highly respected resident of this place, passed away on Wednesday at his home on the second concession, Bosanquet, at the age of 85 years and nine months. He was a son of the late Sylvanus and Mary Cornell, and was born in the Township of Beverly, July 24, 1837.

The family settled in Bosanquet in 1848. He was the eldest of 11 children, six of whom are living. These hardy pioneers of the early 50's hewed a living out of the wilderness and saw the country pass from one of Indian trails to a land of prosperity, with beautiful churches and good schools, good roads and fine dwellings. The family has always been identified with Baptist church work.

In politics he was an ardent Conservative. No more familiar figure has been known in this locality than Uncle John, as he was familiarly called by the young people. He was said to have more nephews than any other resident of this locality.

The deceased leaves three daughters and two sons. Mrs. Henry Traver of Bosanquet; Mrs. Manford Kemp, Thedford; Mrs. G. L. Savage, Capac, Mich.; Sylvanus and Chester Cornell of Edmonton, Alta. There are also four brothers and two sisters surviving. They are Abram Cornell of Brandon, Man.; Enoch, of Thedford, and George and Edward of Stoughton, Sask.; Mrs. at Kaskine, Wintemute of Hamilton, and Mrs. Stillwell of Kelsey, Wash.

The funeral was held on Friday afternoon, Rev. Mr. Jones, Baptist minister of Arkona, conducting the services. Interment was made in the Baptist cemetery.

A by-law was passed appropriating \$1200.00 to road division No. 1 and \$1850.00 to each of Divisions 2, 3 and 4. Mr. Shepherd was appointed to serve copies of the Coults Drain by-law and Mr. Walden to repair a ditch in front of lots 12 and 13 River Road.

The following orders were given: Cyrus Gratton \$21.75 for stringers and fixing bridge River road; R.D. Thomson \$6 serving copies of Shawana Drain by-law, Hy Fawcett \$5.00 for a road grader.

Council adjourned to meet on Monday, May 7th, at 10 a.m. as a Court of Revision on Shawana drain by-law and general business and also on Monday, May 21st at one o'clock p.m. as a Court of Revision on the Coults drain and for general business.

OBITUARY

Wm. Williamson was born in Watford, Ontario, Jan. 28th, 1842, and passed from this life at his home in Northport, Mich., April 18th, 1923 at the age of 81 years, 2 mos. and 20 days.

On Nov. 19, 1867 he was united in marriage to Magdalena Brown of Watford and two years later, 1869, they immigrated to this country settling on a farm near to Omena, Mich.

To this union were born nine children, two Mrs. Melinda Miller and Mrs. Florence Lackey having preceded him to the Great Beyond. Those still living are Mrs. Magdalene McGuire and Mrs. Laura Kolz, both of Traverse City; Perry of Grand Rapids; Mrs. Alice Scott, of Omena; Mrs. Elsie Crowl of Orange, Cal.; Mrs. Elsie Crowl of Detroit and Mrs. Ada Telgard of Northport.

On account of his failing health Mr. and Mrs. Williamson were compelled to leave their farm about eighteen years ago, moving to their present home at Northport. About a year ago his daughter, Mrs. Telgard and her husband, moved from Pont Huron to her father's home here to help care for him.

Deceased was a life member of the Northport Lodge No. 265 A.F. & A.M. He united with the Methodist Episcopal church of Northport on confession of faith May 20, 1917.

He was one of a family of fourteen children of whom his brothers, Benjamin and Isaac of Watford and Albert of Sarnia, Ont., and one sister, Mrs. Margaret Crews of Prince Albert, Sask., survive him.

He is also survived by nineteen grandchildren and three great grand children. Although many of his old neighbors and friends have preceded him yet his presence will be missed by many of the later generation.
