## New-Brunswick Provincial Parliament.

HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY.

February 8.

A Bill to incorporate the St. Croix Bridge

Company: passed the House.

According to the order of the Day, the

amendment made by the Legislative Council

to the Bill to incorporate the St. Andrews

Mill and Manufacturing Company, was read

a third time.—Resolved, That the House do

concur therein.

Ordered, That Mr. Boyd do return the

Bill, with the amendment, and acquaint them

therewith.

On motion of Mr. Hill.—The House again

went into Committee of the whole on a Bill

in amendment of and in addition an Act re-

lating to the collection of Duty on Timber

and other Lumber.

The Chairman reported, that the Commit-

tee having the Bill referred to them under

an amendment thereto, and then agreed to the

said Bill, under the Title of—

A Bill for the relief of the Trade of the

County of Charlotte.—Ordered, That the

Report be accepted, and the Bill engrossed,

as amended, under the amended Title.

Mr. Dibble, Master in Chancery, informed

the House that the Council had agreed to

The Bill to incorporate the St. Andrews

Whale Fishing Company; with amendments

to which they desire the concurrence of the

Assembly.

On motion of Mr. Fisher.

The House went into Committee of the

whole on a Bill to vacate the Seats of Mem-

bers of the Assembly in certain cases.

Mr. Jordan in the Chair of the Committee,

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair.

The Chairman reported, that the Commit-

tee having the Bill before them and the first

section thereof being under their considera-

tion, which declares the persons who shall be

incapable of taking or holding Seats in the

General Assembly upon their accepting cer-

tain appointments, unless re-elected after such

appointments.

It was moved.—To insert the words "Ex-

ecutive Councilors."

And upon the question, the Committee di-

vided as follows:—

YEAS, 15. NAYS, 15.

That the division being equal, he had de-

The Committee then went through the Bill,

and agreed to the same.

State of the Moon.—The observations

made upon the surface of the moon by tele-
