It is remitted to the Presbytery of Quebec to obtain fuller particulars in regard to the said Churches, and otherwise mature the case for the consideration of the Commission of Synod.

COMMISSION TO REV. DONALD MACDONALD.

The Synod being informed that the Rev. Donald Macdonald, Minister at Lochiel, is about to proceed to Scotland, authorize him to seek out young men of suitable qualifications who might be willing to come to this country and study for the ministry in this Church, at Queen's College, Kingston.

PETITION ON SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

The Rev. William Bain submitted a draft of Petition to the Legislature for the passage of the Bill now before the Legislative Council to secure the better observance of the Sabbath. The same is approved of and ordered to be signed by the Moderator in the name and by the appointment of the Synod.

COMMISSION OF SYNOD.

The Synod appoint their Commission to meet in St. Andrew's Church, Kingston, on the first Wednesday in October next at noon, and oftener by adjournment when and where the Commissioners may choose, ordain the Roll of this Synod to be the Roll of the Commission, and invest the Commissioners with the same powers for the same purposes as the Synod's Commission of last year-that is to say, to transact all business referred to them, and determine therein as they shall see fit; attend to such emergent causes as may require immediate action on the part of the Church; watch over the general interests of the Church; receive any References and Appeals that may be made to them by Presbyteries and ripen such affairs for next Synod; and give all needful advice to Presbyteries upon application the present Session by pronouncing the Apostolic Benediction.
