A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk with a Bill (12), intituled: "An Act to provide for revision of the accounting set-up of the Canadian National Railway System," to which they desire the concurrence of the Senate.

The said Bill was read the first time, and—

With leave of the Senate, it was—

Ordered, That it be placed on the Orders of the Day for a second reading to-morrow.

A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk with a Bill (2), intituled: "An Act to amend the Precious Metals Marking Act, 1928," to which they desire the concurrence of the Senate.

The said Bill was read the first time, and—

With leave of the Senate,

The said Bill was then read the second time, and—

Ordered, That it be placed on the Orders of the Day for a third reading to-morrow.

A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk with a Bill (19), intituled: "An Act for the protection of the Dionne Quintuplets," to which they desire the concurrence of the Senate.
