## PRAYERS.

Mr. Winkler, from the Standing Committee on Miscellaneous Private Bills, presented the Seventh Report of the said Committee, which is as follows:—

Your Committee has considered Bill No. 236 (Letter A-8 of the Senate), intituled: "An Act for the relief of Jessie Kathleen Batiste Latter", and has agreed to report it without amendment.

Mr. Gibson (Hamilton West), a Member of the King's Privy Council, presented,—Supplementary Return to an Order of the House of March 14, 1949, for a statement of the names of all persons employed in Yukon Territory by the Federal Government (with the exception of those names in return tabled March 10, 1947), showing where they are serving; in what capacity; their remuneration, and when each was first so employed.

And also,—Return to an Order of the House of April 4, 1949, for a Return showing:—1. As of March 31, 1949, how many salaried postmasters were there in Canada within the following age groups: (a) 60 to 65; (b) 66 to 70; (c) 71 to 75; (d) 76 to 80; (e) over 80?

2. In how many cases do salaried postmasters own the buildings in which post offices are located?

3. Is rent paid to the postmasters in cases where the building owned by the postmaster houses the post office?

4. What method is used in determining the amount of rent which is paid?
