Parsons, W. F.—Second Master of the Herald, (Kellett,) 1846-50.

Master of the Herald, (Denham,) in the subsequent commission. Now retired.

Peard, George.—Eldest son of Vice-Admiral Shuldham Peard. Born at Gosport in 1793. Entered the navy, 1805. First Lieutenant of the Blossom, (Beechey,) 1825-28. He died from the effects of climate in 1837.

Pearse, Richard Bulkeley.—Entered the navy in the Winchester, at the Cape, 1842-45, afterwards in the Constance, in the Pacific, 1846-49. Mate in the Resolute, (Austin,) 1850-51. Acted Lydia in "Done on Both Sides," and Ulrica in Charles XII. Led an auxiliary sledge party to provision Lieutenant Aldrich, as far as Cape Cockburn on Bathurst Island, 24 days away, and marched 208 miles. Severely frost-bitten and eventually lost a leg, for which he receives a pension. Now a retired Captain. F.R.G.S.

Pearse Inlet, on the west coast of Bathurst Island.

Peckover, William.—Gunner in the Discovery, (Clarke,) 1776-80, in Cook's expedition.

PEDDIE, J. S.—Surgeon of the Terror, (Crozier,) 1845-48.

PENNY, WILLIAM.—An experienced whaling Captain, placed in command of two brigs, the Lady Frankiin and Sophia, 1850-51.
