FROGLEGS ALSO RAN IN CLARK HANDICAP

Buckhorn Wins, With Flora Fina Second in Feature Race at Louisville.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., May 17.—Ten thousand persons witnessed the running of the Clark Handicap this afternoon at Churchill Downs. The course was heavy. Froglegs, the great runner of the Schor stable, was favorite, but the winner turned out to be the Canadian-owned horse, Buckhorn, with Flora Fina second. At a meeting of the state racing commission today the Kentucky Endurance Stakes, to be run off in the fall, were awarded to Churchill Downs, which bid \$10,000 for the race. Douglas Park offered \$5500. The summary:
