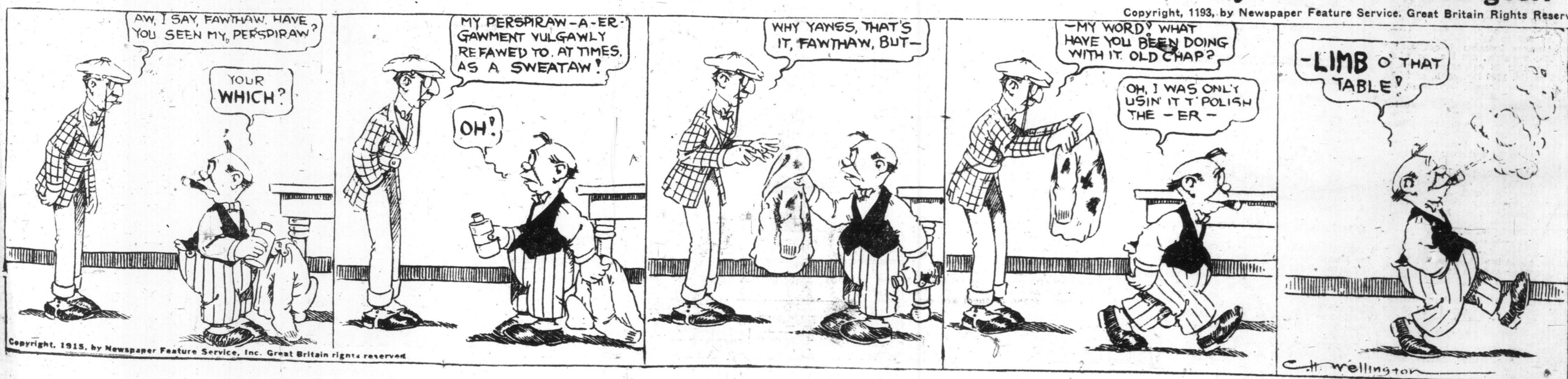

PARI MUTUELS PAY BIG PRICES AT BLUE BONNETS

Commonada and Tom Elward Win Feature Races on Opening Day—Penalty at Great Price.

MONTREAL, June 8.—Serving as an introduction for the pari-mutuel system of betting, the spring meeting of the Montreal Jockey Club was ushered in at the course at Blue Bonnets this afternoon under conditions that could not have been improved on. Fair weather favored the sport, while a card of seven well-filled races run over a mile and a half produced a steady stream of bets and a profitable afternoon for the track.

The pari-mutuels have come to stay in Montreal as evidenced from the expressions of those who visited Blue Bonnets this afternoon.

The system without a hitch. The greatest surprise given the public was the precision with which the amount of the winning ticket was posted on the large board in front of the stand.

The feature of the card of seven races was the running of the Kindergarten Stakes, which is a race for two-year-olds. This was won by Tom Elward, from behind in the stretch to wear the pacemakers down in the closing strides.

Next in importance to the stake was the running of a handicap which was won by Commonada from a small but select field.
