WHAT'S THE COST OF COAL? DEALER SAYS \$6.49 A TON

Toronto and Montreal seem to be paying most for their supply.

What should be the reasonable price for a ton of coal?

In yesterday's World, the cost of coal at the International Bridge was given at \$4.91 a ton, freight to Toronto at 90 cents, expenses of delivery to the consumer, 40 cents.

One dealer asserts that a large proportion of the coal being delivered in Ontario contracts made early in the season at \$5.00 a ton.

At \$7.25 a ton, however, Torontonians are paying more than are consumers elsewhere, except in Montreal.

Niagara Falls, N.Y. (International bridge), \$6.25 after Nov. 1, \$6.50. Montreal—\$7.25 a ton; \$4 for half a ton.


Catharines—\$6.75; one or two dealers selling at \$6.50 to old customers.

HAMILTON WILL ABOLISH FEES IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

OTTAWA FAVORED STATION VOTED DOWN THE HOTEL

They Have Turned Down Their Own Proposition, Said Fourth Vice-President.

OTTAWA, Oct. 3.—(Special.)—After a very heated argument the finance committee by a vote of five to three last night decided to recommend to the city council to grant the necessary fixed assessments for the new million-dollar central station.

It is really thought this time the long heralded new station to accommodate all railways entering Ottawa is assured.

The hotel proposition in Major Hill Park was turned down by a vote of five to three, but it is thought another attempt will be made in the council Monday to bring it up again.

Fourth Vice-President Wainwright of the G.T.P. was present, and said after the meeting, "Well, as for the hotel, it is their own proposition that they turned down, and if they don't want it now they are not bound to have one."
