The injury to good crops in important Russian provinces, the sudden and remarkable demand for American cargoes for India, where drought and hot winds have threatened sections with famine, and the further revival of the Australian demand on American wheat and flour. The situation has at last impressed itself on the grain markets on taking further chances for the future. They are buying in a determined way. This buying has set every market in the country humming. Northwest receipts were 835 cars, against 1200 cars last year.

Corn, oats and provisions followed wheat to a large extent, and all had good advances, corn selling at 29%c May. Oats, 22c May and pork 8.10 Jan. The buying of the articles was good. Cudahy's brokers bought largely of pork and ribs. The advances were well maintained, and the markets closed firm at the top.
