A Beer Park Strike.

The strike on the Deer Park yesterday created a stir in that stock, and brokers were bustling about to get all they possibly could to fill orders. It has been known for sometime that the condition of the ore body was 'mproving, but yesterday's assay astonished everybody. It showed aggregate values of nearly \$500.

The strike was encountered while crosscutting, and showed a pay streak 18 inches in width, and in a body of ore so extensive that there are no signs of walls on either side. The rich deposit is on the 200 foot level and the strike will aid materially in advancing properties in the south belt. The assay showed 250 ounces of sliver, and \$270 in gold, with copper sufficient to make up an aggregate value of close to \$500. This fortunate strike forebodes well for adjoining properties, especially the Silver Bell, which has been leased on such a plan that it is to be worked for two years and stockholders are to receive half the profits.—Rossland Miner.

Bistrict Spraying.

W. M. Orr of Fruitlands and George E. Fisher of Burlington yesterday interviewed the Minister and Deputy Minister-of Agriculture touching the provincial regulations regarding the San Jose scale and the arrangements for giving instruction in spraying or or chards throughout Ontario.
