



Port au Prince, Hayti, May 16.—
There was further disturbances here last night. At about 10 p.m. a mob attacked the palace, but the rloters were fired on by the Presidential guard and eventually dispersed. Some of the attacking party were killed or wounded. The revolutionists in the north have rejected the overtures made to them with the object of averting civil war. They took this action after raising a loan of \$50,000 guaranteed by the customs receipts of Cape Haytlen and Gonaives, the two ports in their hands. The northern army, consequently, will soon begin its march on Port au Prince.
