

London, March 28.—The clocks
were pushed ahead in London one
hour at 2 o'clock this morning, in
keeping with the daylight-saving
scheme.

Wen Sound, March 28. — Owen can boast of being the first to get on Georgian bay free of ice. The sun and south wind of the 27th had rotted the ice in Owen Sound bay, so that when a southeaster sprang up on Friday morning it easily broke up. The ice drove it into Georgian bay. The break-up is remarkable, in view of the fact that in many places the ice was two feet thick this year and ended well into Georgian bay. Owen Sound harbor is one of the last to be opened and the earliest to open again.
