REMARKS.

1st. The General Committee wish to express its gratitude to the numerous DONORS to the Jubilee Fund; and rejoices that at the Public Meetings held throughout the Province much valuable information was diffused relative to the origin and progress of our Denomination, which has resulted in the sympathy of large numbers of the people, and the increasing extension and stability of our cause in Canada.

2nd. The grant made to the Book Room from the FUND was expended in Book Stock, which is nearly all sold, and the cash received paid to the General Treasurer, and appropriated under the direction of the General Missionary Committee, to carry on the Missionary Work, principally on New Mission Stations.

3rd. From the Balance Sheet it will be seen that the largest portion of the Fund has been devoted to the JUBILEE MISSION, which was commenced in October, 1861, in the Huron District, where the gospel was greatly needed. The success of the enterprise is shown from the late Conference Report of the Station, which includes 112 Members, 2 Missionaries, 9 Local Preachers, 11 Class Leaders, 4 Connexional Churches erected, 8 other Preaching Places established, 1 Sunday School, and 86 Scholars. We trust, therefore, that the Jubilee Mission will very shortly be self-sustaining, and in its turn assist with its means the General Missionary Committee to originate other Mission Stations in the Province.
