In addition to the above, we are happy to state, that many of the socie-
ties already established, are increasing in the numbers of their members;
other societies are in contemplation, in various parts of the Province, and
by a letter dated 17th August, we were informed that a society was talked
of at Sydney Mines, which we have no doubt is now in full operation.—A
Temperance Convention was formed on the 22d April, 1834, composed of
officers of the several societies in Queen's County, and a Temperance Hall
has been erected at Liverpool, which was formally opened on Wednesday
evening, Sept. 10, 1834, "and set apart for those special purposes, which its
name indicates." A Convention was also organized at Bridgetown, on the
14th Sept. last, composed of delegates from the societies of the Western and
Middle Divisions of the Province, which will hold its second meeting at An-
napolis, Sept 25, 1835. A meeting of Delegates from the Eastern part of the
Province and Prince Edward Island, took place at Pictou, on the 9th July
1835. A Central Society is also established in Halifax, composed of dele-
gates from each society in the Province, and designated the Provincial Tem-
perance Society.

We thank those gentlemen in various parts of the Province for their
attention in forwarding the statements connected with Temperance, agreea-
bly to the request in our last Almanack; and beg to solicit, by the 1st Sept.
any further information they may be enabled to forward.
