Sir,

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your Circular 14 6², dated the 11th instant, regarding provisions made for protection against fire. In compliance with your request, a full report on the subject will accompany my School Report for the December quarter.

However, I beg to state at once that the buckets we have here, are iron buckets which are hardly fit to be used in case of fire, and I think it would be advisable to get rubber buckets for that purpose.

I, therefore, apply for a supply of five rubber buckets for the use of this institution; there are none for sale at Kamloops, but upon inquiry, I am told that they can be laid down here for \$36.00 a dozen. One dozen, I think, would be sufficient.
