THE WHEAT CROP

OTTAWA, Aug. 21.—Col. A. D. Davidson, president of the Saskatchewan Valley Land Company, after a tour of the Canadian West, writes that the wheat crop of the Canadian West this season will probably be ninety-seven million bushels. That of Alberta and Saskatchewan, he added, will be better than last year.

Says the Winnipeg Commercial: "The opinions of some pessimists that the crop condition will cause a decline in the price of wheat are absurd. Even admitting that the yield would be less this fall, it is estimated each acre of wheat will be worth about \$2 more than last year. That would mean that the total value of this year's wheat would exceed that of 1906 by \$10,000,000. Where, then, is there room for the opinion that poor production will curtail the money circulation of the country?"
