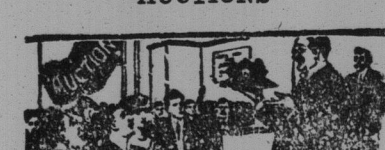

FORD TO BUILD IN ENGLAND.

\$250,000 Plant at Southampton to
Turn Out 50,000 Cars Annually.

Among the crowd of 500 persons who
went to Polokon yesterday to see the
Holland-America liner Nieuw Amsterdam
sail were Henry Ford and Thomas
A. Edison. They went to say good-bye
to L. D. Perry, who has charge of the
Ford interests in Great Britain, and
who has been spending a month in this
country with his wife. Mr. Perry said
he had been working with Mr. Ford
over the plans to erect a big plant near
Southampton, England, for the manu-
facture of automobiles.

B. R. Brown, one of the engineers at
the Detroit plant, sailed with Mr. Perry
and has the plans with him for a \$2,500,000
cars annually.

ST. WALTER AND PERONE

Sir Walter Scott anticipated the war
correspondents with a characteristically
exact description of the ground over
which one ally has moved upon Per-
one, "Perone," he writes, "situated
upon a deep river in a flat country, and
surrounded by strong bulwarks and pre-
pared for attack, was accounted in ancient
times as one of the strongest
fortresses in France." And he reminds
us that "though lying on an exposed
and warlike frontier, it was never taken
by an enemy" until the Duke of Wel-
lington achieved that feat in 1815. The
Prussians were to repeat that perform-
ance 86 years later, assisted by an out-
break of an epidemic amongst the defend-
ers.
