



**Canadians to Attend** Col. Boyle's Funeral

his exploits in the Great War, died at the home of a friend in Middlesex on The Canadian High Commissioner, who is on the continent, will be repre-sented at the funeral, and a floral wreath will also represent the tribute of the Canadian Government. F. C. Wade, agent-general for British Co-lumbia, will attend on behalf of his province, and will lay a wreath on the

When the Bolshevists refused to hand over sixty Rumanian prisoners, Boyle flew into a Bolshevist camp by French airplane, leaped into the boat occupied by the prisoners, without cap or baggage, and made the Russians take him with the prisoners to Crimea, where he persuaded the Russians to keep their word and release the Rumanians. Boyle returned in triumph to Bucharest."


