IODINE IS PUT FIRST AMONG ANTISEPTICS
specially Preferred in Industrial Surgery, Conference Physicians Find.

(New York Times.)
Iodine still holds first place as a skin disinfectant in surgical medicine. It is against the danger of burns and the discomfort it causes rather than its efficiency as a sterilizing agent. In spite of the great popularity of chlorin compounds in the treatment of war wounds, iodine still holds its general popularity and favor in medical circles in the treatment of injuries in civil life.

The Conference Board of Physicians in industry, which acts as adviser to the National Industrial Conference Board, 10 East Thirty-ninth street, on medical problems in industry, recently investigated the extent to which iodine is used as a wound disinfectant in industrial work, the strength in which it is used and the method of preliminary cleansing of the wound before the application of iodine and dressings.

Replies were received from sixty-five physicians, all of whom were doing industrial work or surgery closely allied to surgery. Forty-five replied that they used a solution of five per cent. strength of iodine and twenty used U. S. P. or reater strength. A few industrial physicians said they did not use iodine, or only sparingly. These were, however, not disinfectants as dichloramin-T, ionic acid, Dakin's solution and similar products. The objection to iodine was that it caused irritation, but the preliminary cleansing of the wound with iodine is a most satisfactory method of preparing the wound area for iodine to be used as alcohol and other antiseptic agents. In the preliminary cleansing of wounds, gasoline, alone or in conjunction with benzene or ether, is used more than any other antiseptic. Other agents used are soap and water, alcohol, glycol, creolin, cresol and similar products.

Research by surgeons and prominent medical men has shown that iodine is particularly valuable because of its penetrating power and because it irritates so little. It subjects a wound stimulates healing.

ONCE GAVE BEAUTY BOOK MADE OUT OF BANK NOTES

Duval, Famous Paris Restaurateur, Made the Millions Fly.

London, March 13. — (By Canadian Press.)—M. Alexandre Duval, the most famous restaurateur of Paris for more than a generation, who died last month, was the last link between the "society" of the empire and the republic of France. Certainly he was the last "bouillotte" of the Duval restaurants, which he founded, were popular with tourists from the British Isles, as it did not require overmuch money to eat there, and a quarter of a century ago Duval's was a crowded resort of Englishmen.

M. Duval was born before Louis Napoleon became emperor. He was of humble beginnings—his parents kept a butcher shop and made a fortune out of it. The lady, however, was not of a literary turn of mind, and tossed the book aside, not suspecting that it contained a fortune. The "grand passion," fortunately for Duval, came to an end before he was ruined. He attempted suicide by shooting himself in the head. He was cured of his wound, and, at the same time, cured of his passion.

Then Duval began to repair the fortune which he had largely frittered away upon his once beloved Cora Pearl. He became a patron of theatres and horse races, and continued his dashing career, but there was never another "woman in the case." To the end he was the gay M. Duval, though in his seventy-seventh year when he died.

FIGHT FLOATING BOOZE PALACE
Prohibition Chief in the U. S. Sends Warning to New York Promoter.

Washington, March 11.—Prohibition Commissioner Haynes served notice yesterday that there would be no "floating booze palace" just outside the three-mile limit off New York if he could prevent it. He had a conference with Ralph A. Day, prohibition enforcement director of New York, who came to Washington to confer with him in regard to the proposed establishment of such a source of relief for thirsty New Yorkers. After the conference he dictated a letter to James V. Martin of the Recreation Ticket Corporation of New York, who, Mr. Day informed him, proposed to establish a "recreation vessel" outside New York harbor.

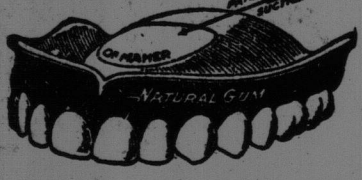
