UNIONISTS 240; COALITION 302

This Was British Election Standing Last Night—A Shot at Balfour

London, Dec. 13.—The election continues to drag wearily along. The public has lost interest and the newspapers have given up publishing late elections. Fleet street and other points where returns are shown are deserted. The standing of the parties tonight is as follows: Government coalition, Liberals 199, Nationalists 23, Independent Nationalists, 2, Laborites, 86, total, 302. Opposition, Unionists, 240.

Party feeling continues to run strong in Cork where there are conflicts between the opposing factions. David Sheehy, member of the house of commons, in a riot today, was struck by a stone and so badly injured that he remained unconscious for some time. Not less than 100 persons have been surgically treated in the Cork infirmary since the elections began.

London, Dec. 13.—The tariff reform agitation, which has been the subject of a long and bitter struggle, has been defeated. A dramatic change of this kind, it is said, should not be initiated in the middle of a general election, nor at all, without full deliberation, perhaps in no case by defenders of the constitution. It says: "Everyone now knows the original inspiration for the tariff reformism came from Chamberlain's enemies in the Unionist camp, the faction at whose helms a fair chance of victory for tariff reform was thrown away for something not worth 100 pounds in a single constituency. The tariff reformers must insist without delay on having clear course to run in their association with the Unionist party."

The tea and sale in the assembly rooms of the Nickel Theatre last evening by the "Nurses' Association" was a pronounced success financially as well as socially, and the young ladies in charge of the affair were very much gratified over the outcome.

Tea was served from 5 to 7 o'clock and the tables were filled almost continuously. Following this there was a sale of fancy goods and an entertainment to which Floyd Baxter, soloist at the Nickel, contributed, and there were many novelties at which the visitor could find amusement and entertainment. About 820 persons, including a large number of gentlemen, were present and a thoroughly enjoyable time.
