## AUSTRIA WAGES WINNING FIGHT TO GET ON FEET

Economic Position of Nation Rapidly Becoming Stable Under Policy of Thrift and Hard Work in Every Line.

Paris, March 18.—In an interview in "Le Petit Parisien" Herr Gruenberger, Austrian Minister of Foreign Affairs, gave an interesting summary of Austria's foreign and domestic policy since the end of the war. He said:

"Since the armistice Austria's foreign policy has been directed exclusively to the country's economic reconstruction. This policy has proved incontestable results, however paradoxical that statement may seem when one considers Austria's present economic position."

"Our country, almost completely deprived of coal and cut off at the conclusion of the peace treaty from its principal source of communications, because of measures taken by neighboring states, has been able, thanks to the policy which it has followed, to become once more an economic center."

Treaties Made by Austria. "In the first place, Austria concluded commercial treaties with Czechoslovakia, With Jugoslavia similar negotiations have been in progress for a long time. There is ground for hoping that the visit which Chancellor Leopold will make to that country will bring these negotiations to a successful conclusion."

"The dispute over Burgenland was adjusted, and even during the process of adjustment, Austria did everything she could to re-establish normal commercial relations with Hungary. The Austrian Parliament has just ratified a commercial treaty with Poland, and negotiations for a similar treaty are progressing with Italy."

"In the course of the first two periods, now ended, of internal reorganization, Austria partially executed the measures which she had recognized beforehand as necessary."

"The different government services which deal with public economy are being organized on the same basis as private enterprises. This reorganization will take effect very shortly. It is already in effect in the postal and telephone services and in the tobacco monopoly."

Bank Is Established. "An Austrian bank of issue has been established and is functioning with complete success, as the first two audits show."

"The interior loan had extraordinary favorable results. The \$100 million loan—proves that the policy of the present government has restored confidence in the Austrian state."

"Economic experts hold it at the present distress in Austria ought to be overcome gradually by financial reforms and domestic legislation. But it is indispensable that some foreign assistance be given in the form of credits."

"The normal budget requires a credit of 620,000,000 gold crowns, exclusive of the sums necessary to repay certain Austrian bonds made to Austria. Including these sums, the credit would be increased to 680,000,000 gold crowns. The expenses for which the normal Austrian budget makes provision amount to 287,000,000 gold crowns. It ought to be possible to cover them through internal retrenchments and taxation. This can be accomplished in two years, if the credits we need are granted to us."

"I am interested on such a loan, reaching the maximum of 680,000,000 gold crowns, will not exceed 70,000,000 gold crowns. It will be covered by pig-ironing our forests, our public domain, our customs and our tobacco monopoly."

TYPHUS EPIDEMIC PERIL THWARTED IN VOLGA DISTRICT

Samara, Feb. 1.—(By Mail).—Typhus which scourged the Volga Valley and claimed thousands of victims from one end of Russia to the other last year, has appeared this winter only in scattered localities, and unless the unexpected occurs medical authorities consider the danger of epidemics on a vast scale is ended.

There are several areas in the Volga Valley and the Ukraine where the 1922 harvests fared poorly, and in these famine already is raging again. Nothing like the terrible conditions of the ghastly winter of 1921-22 exist, however, and although 8,000,000 persons are listed as needing complete or partial support by charity even the most pessimistic observers will be repeated in the proportions of last year.

GERMANS PLAN WAR IN SECRET, PARIS CHARGES

In Effect When Least Expected, Say French

Hidden Stores of Arms—Press Accused of Working Up Sentiment Among People to Start Conflict.

Paris, March 15.—Can Germany fight France? The best German military authorities say she cannot. They would say that even if she were able to, it is more important to know what the French experts think.

In a recent article in "Le Journal" M. Henry Bidot summarizes the best French opinion on this subject. He says:

"Germany has protested against the occupation of the Ruhr, but at the same time she has been re-arming. She has doubled her army and she has increased her armaments."
