NEWS IN BRIEF

Five hundred home-sickers from Eastern Canada in Winnipeg, Manitoba, have been brought home.

Lightning and wind caused considerable damage to the crops in the vicinity of St. John's, Nfld.

Philippe Bellefleur, proprietor of the Three Rivers steam laundry, was instantly killed while working an electric motor.

The Commercial Company have completed the laying of a cable from New York to St. John's, Nfld., a distance of 1,500 miles.

Mrs. Stellen, wife of a Jewish doctor of Winnipeg, quarrelled with her husband and then dived with four thousand dollars of his money.

Wm. Morris had both legs cut off by a C. P. R. train at Kenora. He lay on the track four hours before found, dying shortly afterwards.

The Canadian and Newfoundland Ministers will protest to the Imperial authorities against the use of steam trawlers in the North American fisheries.

MEXICO IS SHAKEN

A Violent Earthquake Is Felt in Southern Republic

THIRTEEN PERSONS KILLED

Twenty More Are Known to Be Mortally Injured by Sharp Shocks That Sweep Over an Area of a Thousand Square Miles — Mexico City Suffers and Acapulco is Partially Razed Yesterday.

Mexico City, July 31.—With Chihuahua destroyed and Acapulco partly razed and the loss of life phenomenal, Central Mexico from Queretaro on the north to Oaxaca on the south, an area of more than 1,000 square miles, was shaken at an early hour yesterday by a series of the most severe earth shocks in the region for the last quarter of a century.

The quake was severe in Mexico City, but not prolific in destruction. Reports telling of the loss of life are meagre, but several figures thus far given show 13 killed and more than a score mortally injured.

White world comes from U. S. An American newspaper traveler at Chihuahua, Guerrero, that that city was destroyed and the inhabitants are living in the open, suffering from the elements. This movement was of a devastating character and lasted with marked severity 50 seconds.

Rust Cannot Hurt Much. Toronto, July 31.—"If the western Canada wheat crops is due for a setback by rust, we will hear about it in a fortnight, and that is what the rust is getting now," he continued.

Atlantic Cables Not Out. London, July 31.—(C.A.P. Cable.)—At a meeting yesterday of the Anglo-American Cable Co., the chairman stated that although the Eastern Telegraph Co. had reduced the rates on press cables, the Atlantic companies had no such intention.

Celebrate Wolfe's Victory. London, July 31.—(C.A.P. Cable.)—The 120th anniversary of Wolfe's victory at Quebec will be celebrated by a banquet on Sept. 13. A committee, headed by Lord Roberts, has in hand the execution of a bronze statue of Wolfe.

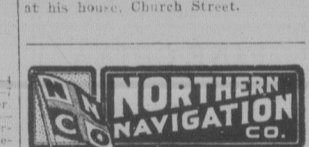
