BIG SALMON RUN BEGINS IN STRAITS

Between Sixteen and Eighteen Thousand Fish Lifted in the Todd-Munzie Traps.

Mr. Daykin, lighthouse keeper at Carranah, reports the Straits full of salmon this morning. Large numbers of whales, sharks, blackfish and porpoises are in sight, evidently in pursuit of the silvery fish.

Following on this announcement comes the news that between sixteen and eighteen thousand salmon were lifted in the four traps operated by Messrs. Todd Munzie. This is the largest individual catch of the season so far reported in the Straits, and it would appear that the big run to which all canners have been looking forward has at last set in.
