A Prosperous Church.

The annual meeting of St. Andrew's Church was held in the hall of the church last Wednesday evening. Mr. A. Anderson was chairman and Mr. George Stothart, secretary. There was a large attendance. Rev. D. Henderson presented the report of the Kirk Session, from which it appeared that the missionary contributions were about \$145 larger than the previous year, and that about \$800 had been contributed to the Country Fund.

Members D. P. Macdonald, chairman, and Geo. S. Stothart, Treasurer, reported on behalf of the Board of Trustees, the best year in the history of the congregation. After making the final payment of the debt of \$5,000, intended for improvements made on the church more than two years ago, and meeting all current expenses, a balance of over \$400 remains in the treasury. St. Andrew's Church is now a "thriving tree of freedom from debt."

The Sunday School reported a prosperous year. Receipts exceeded expenditures by some \$50.

The Ladies' Aid Society contributed \$200 from its funds to the liquidation of the debt last year, for which a hearty

note of thanks was passed by the congregation. The reports of the W. F. M. S. Young People's Society, were of the most encouraging character, and showed such development of the work to be in a healthy condition.

The trustees made special mention of the kindness of the Hon. L. J. Tweedie and Mrs. Tweedie in placing their grounds at the disposal of the congregation for their successful garden party last August, and the earnest and grateful mention of the service of private "a" daylight, an inspiration, and a true aid to worship in the highest and best sense.
