Boston, Oct. 25.—To establish a defensive case for Rev. Mr. Richeson in the Linnell murder case, detectives were busy today in another state. They hope to show that another man had the same opportunity to secure cyanide of potassium and to administer it to Avis Linnell, as the police charge Mr. Richeson had. By this move they hope to establish that a man friendly to Avis had a considerable quantity of the poison which caused her death in his possession shortly before the murder, and that he saw her just before her death. By working along this line the case the police have laid against the prisoner is paralleled.
