CABLE STEAMER TO

TO REPAIR ISLAND CABLE

The government cable steamer Terian is in port and is making repairs to the cable which is broken between Partridge Island and the main line. This is the third time that the cable has been broken, and it is believed that mud scows with their hatch doors lowered catches and breaks the cable when they are being towed over this section near the west channel.

SCH. CALABRIA

ARRIVES WITH COAL

The schooner Calabria, Captain Gayton, arrived yesterday morning from Perth Amboy with 450 tons of coal for C. E. Colwell. The schooner made a good passage to this port.

WINTERPORT NOTES AND CARGO VALUATIONS

The C. P. R. line steamer Empress of Ireland, Captain Forster, was 73 miles northeast of Cape Sable at 8 a. m. yesterday, bound for Halifax and St. John.

Captain Carey of the steamer Lake Erie, reports a good voyage out from Havre, she having only encountered one storm.

The Allan line steamer Tunisian, for Liverpool, took away Canadian goods valued at \$124,811 and foreign goods valued at \$200,942, making a total valuation of \$325,757. Her grain shipments are 47,909 bushels wheat, 17,544 bushels barley. She also took away 23,000 bushels flax.

The steamer Yola finished loading a general cargo for South Africa and will sail this morning about seven o'clock.

BATTLE LINER ARRIVES.

The Battle liner Leutra, Captain Butler, from Santa Fe, arrived at Havre yesterday.

WILL CONVERT HANCOCK INTO A COAL BARGE

The barquentine Hancock, Captain Nickerson, arrived in port from Port Clyde yesterday in tow of the tug Springhill. The Hancock will be stripped and converted into a coal barge by the Dominion Coal Company. The Hancock is about 39 years of age and has done good service as a sailing vessel.

STMR. YOLA SAILS THIS MORNING

The steamer Yola finished loading at the L. C. R. wharf last night and has a full general cargo for South Africa and will sail this morning at seven o'clock.

STMR. PONTIAC MAKES FAST VOYAGE.

The steamer Pontiac has certainly been making some very fast voyages. She has completed the second round voyage between the cotton port in Savannah and England in the fast time of 104 days.

BORNU SAILS FROM NEWPORT NEWS.

The steamer Borna from Progresso for this port arrived at Newport News yesterday for coal and sailed yesterday for St. John. It is expected that the Borna will arrive here Sunday night or Monday.

SHIPS ARE DELAYED WAITING FOR A CHANCE TO BERTH.

Shipping men are complaining somewhat about the delay that ships have at the present time to undergo berthage at this wharf and the Long wharf. The Bengore Head which has been at anchor in the harbor for a few days was only yesterday afternoon enabled to go to berth at the Long wharf where she can receive cargo from the L. C. R. cars and freight shed. There are only two berths at this wharf and during the first of the week when there were no less than eleven steamships in port at the one time there was a scarcity of dock room for the L. C. R. pier and the ships that had cargo to take in there were somewhat delayed awaiting their turn. The steamship Wakana has been anchored in the harbor for a couple of days waiting a chance to get a berth at the L. C. R. and it is most probable that she will get into berth today when the steamer Yola sails for South Africa. The L. C. R. elevator is full of grain and there are hundreds of cars waiting to be emptied into the elevator bins for shipment to the old country.

STEAMSHIP MOVEMENTS.

The Head Line steamship Bengore Head sailed from the harbor at noon yesterday afternoon to the Long wharf where she will receive grain and general cargo. The Donaldson line steamer Cassandra shifted over from No. 4 berth, Sand Point, yesterday morning to the McLeod wharf where she is discharging general cargo.

PARRBORO SCHOONER MAKES LONG VOYAGE TO HAVANA.

Parrboro, Jan. 30.—The Parrboro tier schooner Margaret arrived at Havana today. She was thirty-eight days out from Parrboro and anxiety was felt for her safety. There is a great contrast between the time that it took the Margaret to make the trip to Havana and the flying voyage the schooner Harry Miller took from this port to Monte (Cristo recently when she was blown there by the heavy gales.

C. P. R. STEAMSHIPS RENAMED TO ENTER A NEW SERVICE.

Montreal, Jan. 30.—The Lake Champlain and Lake Erie which are to be used in the C. P. R. "Canadian service" have been renamed. Their new names have been derived from provinces Austria, the Tyrolia, and Ruthenia. The Lake Champlain has been renamed the Ruthenia and the Lake Erie the Tyrolia.

Provincial Board of Health.

Fredericton, Jan. 30.—The annual meeting of the Provincial Board of Health was held at the Provincial Building last evening. Dr. E. O. Steeves, of Moncton, presided and Dr. Mullin, of Moncton, and Dr. Mullin, K. C. of St. John, were appointed a committee to appear before the provincial government to arrange for the printing of the new by-laws governing plumbing regulations and other matters.

NEWCASTLE NEWS

Sir Max Aitken Makes Splendid Donation Toward New Sunday School for St. James' Presbyterian Church.

Newcastle, Jan. 29.—At the meeting of St. James' Presbyterian trustees this week it was announced that Sir Max Aitken had donated \$1,900 towards the new Sunday school hall, for which a \$1,000 site had already been bought and paid for and about \$3,000 collected for the building fund. A very handsome and costly cut glass bowl, worth about \$5,000, will stand on the Mitchell lot opposite the present St. James' Hall.
