FROM WHOM RECEIVED.	QUESTION.	ANSWER.
Rev. A. F. Dempsey...	Are all Ministers who are in connexion, Deputy Grand Chaplains?.....	No.
Thomas Tusk.....	Why will he not be permitted to attend his Lodge?.....	Because your Lodge has suspended you.
	2. Is he suspended from the Order?.....	Answered in the reply to the first question.
	3. Will the Executive direct the Lodge to re-admit him as he considers his Lodge has acted unconstitutionally by him?.....	No. The action of your Lodge must stand until you appeal first to the District, then, if necessary, to the County, and from the County to the Provincial.
	4. If the Executive of the Provincial G. L. will not set aside the action of his Primary Lodge, has the Hon. J. H. Cameron power to order his restoration?	No. The power of the M. W. the G. M., is confined within constitutional limits. The decision of any Lodge must be acted upon until it is constitutionally repealed.
Rev. W. Wilmott.....	Has a last Past Master who is out on certificate, a vote in the District Lodge?	No. Those who do not bear the responsibilities of the Order, are not permitted to enjoy its privileges.
George Brown, J. P.....	Is there any work specially defining the duties and explaining the manner in which they should be performed of a District M?.....	None save the Constitution and the G. Lodge Reports. But N. C. Gowan is preparing a work on Orangeism which will explain the powers and duties and responsibilities of each officer of the Order.

Mark Armstrong..... Should the County Master give the Annual to Masters of Primary Lodges?..... No. For then Primary Lodges might be in debt to the District Treasury and yet have the Annual. Members of Primary Lodges should only get the Annual from their own Master; he from the District Master, who should set it from the C. M. This is the
