held up high the standard they believed as right,—and upon the women of to-day devolves the responsibility of demanding what shall be the standard of true Christian Womanhood and Manhood.

For women, as well as men, this is a momentous hour, let them bestir themselves to action, for there is room for all.

"Hold high your lights, That I may see the way."

After the papers had been read, Miss Willard addressed the meeting for a few moments in her happy and instructive style. At the close of which the Convention adjourned until 2 r.m.

## AFTERNOON SESSION.

The afternoon session was principally a business meeting. After a hymn had been sung, and a prayer offered by Mrs. Kemble, the president made a few remarks. Dr. Jennie K. Trout, Chairman of Committee on Resolutions, presented the following Resolutions, all of which were heartily adopted by the Convention Assembled:

## REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS.

- 1. Resolved—That in view of the united spirit of Faith, Prayer and earnest Work, which has rested on the Christian Temperance Women of Ontario, during the past year, sincere thanksgiving be rendered to Almighty God, and supplication be made for the continued, and increased presence and power of the Holy Spirit, that we may be filled more specially for effective work during the coming year.
- 2. Resolved—That we will stand by our own organization, first, last and always; and wear the white ribbon as our badge; but that we will give our influence and cordial co-operation to all other Temperance Societies, especially to those based upon the Gospel of Christ.
- 3. Resolved—That this Provincial Union recommends the formation of an National Union for the increase of power, the unity of action and the concentration of our influence as christian women.
- 4. Resolved,—That we arge upon the Auxiliary Unions the duty of utilizing the power of the press by securing notices of all our meetings; also furnishing a column of selected temperance-matter for the local papers; also resolved that we will make common cause with our
