V. And be it further enacted, That the additional Bounty on refined Additional Sugar exported from Great Britain, granted by an Act passed in the fined Sugar present Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act for granting to His exported, Majesty during the present War, and until the Ratification of a Definitive granted by Treaty of Peace, additional Duties on the Importation and Exportation of be allowed on certain Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and on the Tonnage of Ships and any entered to Exporta-Veffels in Great Britain, shall not be paid or allowed on any refined Sugar tion b tore which shall be entered for Exportation before the Seventeenth Day August 17, of August One thousand eight hundred and three; and that the said additional Bounty shall not be paid or allowed on any refined Sugar which shall not have been actually shipped for Exportation within Six Weeks after the Expiration of the faid recited Act passed in the present Session of Parliament.

VI. And whereas it is expedient that a Bounty should be allowed for On Importaa limited Time on the Importation of falted and pickled Salmon, and Salmon and falted dry Cod Fish from the Island of Mr. C. d.
