Results are Out

This year's Student Union election had a voter turn-out of approximately 30% of the student population.

The infamous "no" candidate was defeated unilaterally at last Monday's Student Union election. SU President Elect Wayne Carson, V-P University Affairs James Gill, V-P External Gary Clarke, and V-P Activities Stephan Comeau easily won their yes/no vote. U-P Finance/Administration Kimberly Doyle won the position over Michael Wilson by a margin of 279 votes.

Wayne Carson and James Gill were elected to the Board of

Governors, and Graeme Keirstead won the two year-one seat Senate position.

The race between Kevin Hollis and Luigi Rocca for the 1989 Valedictorian position proved to be a very close one. Luigi Rocca was the victor by a margin of 3 votes.

Grad Class President is Marc Grad Class President 1990 Braithwaite, the Vice-President is John Marshall and the Secretary/Treasurer is Micheal Elliott. Each

defeated the "no's" by a wide margin.

James Gill and Greg Lutes were both acclaimed to a one year position on the Senate.

CFS won the referendum hands down. 74% of the voters said YES to CFS. UNB is now part of the powerful national student organization. The many advantages of CFS should improve the student life at UNB.

False Liquor Card Scandal
