Your telegram of March 2nd,¹ Fur Sealing Convention. H.M. Government have taken steps to ascertain the views of the United States Government with regard to the proposed Conference and have also caused formal enquiries to be made from the Japanese Ambassador as to the nature of the modifications which the Japanese Government desire to see made in the text of the Convention. In the meantime H.M. Government do not propose to return a formal reply to the Japanese Ambassador's note of January 5th, No. 65.² As regards your despatch of February 5th³ enquiries are being made as desired.
