My dear General Clark:

Have just received your telegram this morning. Sincerely hope it will be possible to have.
Trusteeship arranged as indicated in telegram from Mr.
Welken.

I did not quite understand Mr. Walkem being down on the matter, as I felt you were in charge of it, and advised certain of my colleagues that I thought we should still recognize you alone as representing Vancouver interests herein.

However, from your telegram I gather there is no conflict of interest between yourself and Mr. Welkem, and will be very glad to advance the matter any way I can when down this week. I expect to leave Wednesday evening.

I came to the conclusion last summer, from the facts laid before me by you, that it was undoubtedly in the public interest to take hold of this situation at once.
