Sir,

Referring to education work generally in the Carlton Agency the Department, as you are aware, has been for sometime making an effort to effect improvements in the day schools. In order that the outcome may be successful the hearty co-operation of all officials and those interested in the work from other standpoints is absolutely essential. I have to ask you, therefore, to visit these schools as frequently as you find it convenient and report thereon, making any suggestions you may see fit as to desirable improvements. These visits on your part will have a beneficial effect upon the teachers and you should also use your efforts with the Indians with a view to arousing their interest in the education of their children, and thus producing more regular attendance. The Department is confident that with your co-operation good results will be secured.

A supply of Agent's report forms is being sent you, but it is not the wish to confine you to any set form of report.
