
Ottawa, November 27, 1912.

Sir,-

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 19th instant replying to the inquiry of the Department as to the status of Millie Kennedy, whose admission to the Elkhorn Industrial School has been asked for.

In reply I beg to say that the information contained in your letter is not sufficient to enable the Department to decide. The fact that the mother is non-treaty would not make the child ineligible, but if Mrs. Kennedy has been married to Joseph Minney she and the child would take the status of the father and consequently the girl would not be eligible. It will, therefore, be necessary for you to make further inquiries and advise the Department whether she is an Indian or married to a white man and consequently a white.
