

73 DUTY FREE AND DUTIABLE PARCELS: (Continued)

6 Applications made on H.F.s M. 518 and 519 for remittances to commercial firms in Canada must in future be certified by the applicant as follows:-- "Certified that this remittance is not being made for the purpose of purchasing goods of any nature for importation into the United Kingdom as a duty-free gift".

74 DUTIABLE PARCELS:

1. Persons proposing to make direct purchases of articles for importation into the United Kingdom must first obtain application forms, which are issued without charge by the Import Licensing Dpt., Board of Trade, 1-6 Tavistock Square, London, W.C. 1. Such application forms properly completed will then be returned to the Import Licensing Dpt., at the address above noted, after which a licence may be granted. The licence will be retained by the importer until the articles arrive in the United Kingdom, when it will be surrendered and customs duty and purchase tax paid as hereinafter provided.

2. Gift parcels to Canadian Service personnel are routed through the Canadian Postal Corps direct to consignee. Dutiable parcels are passed through the C.P.O. to Postal Customs Depot, which will notify the consignee through the Canadian Postal Corps of the amount of duty and purchase tax required. The consignee will then forward funds to cover duty and purchase tax, together with the import licence above referred to, to the Postal Customs Depot as indicated in the notification forwarded to the consignee. The imported articles will then be forwarded through the Canadian Postal Corps to the consignee.

3. In cases where the duty is charged on an ad valorem basis, C.P.O. cannot assess it without information contained on the import licence. In such cases C.P.O. may request the holder to surrender the import licence, after which the importer will be notified of the duty required.

75 WEARING OF METAL "CANADA" ON SERVICE DRESS:

1. It is noted that officers of some units are still wearing regimental shoulder titles with Service dress instead of the authorized metal "CANADA" badge.

2. Attention is directed to the provisions of Overseas R.O. 2305, as amended by Overseas R.O. 2567, which will be strictly complied with by all officers.
