Dear Inspector.

Returning from Teslin Lake your noters the Long Jimmy Affair was received, for which many thanks.

The party are now at the Head of Dease Lake and continual rows are now taking place. I have written to Jimmy and told him to get back to Liard, as so did Sergt Harvey when passing out. Also Nellie has been instructed to come in here to her house at Dry Town and send the kids to school, she has been placed on the Ration List. Eva can do as she likes, but it is expected that she will come in with Nellie. Long Jim is trying to force her to go back to Liard, it is stated, and she does not want to go.

I consider that Long Jim should be had up, and made to do at least two weeks hard work, not favoured in any way, it would be a good lesson for everybody. Dease Lake crowd are rotten and the U.S.A. element out there take sides in the Affair.

The Prov. Authorities state that there is heaps of room up north, and that Whites who wish to get out should go up there and get a trap-ground and keep themselves. It is expected that many useless persons will come this winter. Therefore the registration of Indian Trapping area are more important than ever. Every Indians over the age of 16 male and female should be provided with an area, and if possible club to-gether and mark off a big district. If such maps even rough could be received at this Office, or sent to your own Headquarters below, The Indian Department would be under much obligation to you folk.

I hope alls well down there. I have told the people in Teslin that perhaps you might show up there, if you took a fancy to and Chief Billy Johnson, a fine fellow is expecting to give you a "good time". My very kindest regard to all, Your flées were used to good effect in Atlin and Teslin, thought of you then. Your friend B. William Game Board has
