Q. Has anyone ever staked the land that you are occupying?

A. I don't know.

Q. How many people live at your place?

A. Just four - two girls and my wife and me.

Q. How many live at Cahoose's place?

A. About twelve.

Q. Who are they?

A. Cahoose, his wife and his children.

Q. No one else?

A. No.

Q. How many children has Cahoose?

A. I believe he has ten children and his father and mother.

Q. Have you buildings on the land that you occupy?

A. Oh yes - I have a house, stables, cattle sheds and fences.

Q. How much fencing would you have?

A. About two or three miles.

Q. How many horses have you?

A. One hundred and thirty horses.

Q. How many cattle?

A. I have no cattle - I sold them all.

Q. Do you plow land there?

A. No - it is just a meadow.

Q. And you cut hay there for your stock?

A. Yes.

Q. Have you any farming implements?

A. I have a mowing machine, rakes, waggons and two aleighs.

Q. Have you hay enough to feed your horses during the winter?

A. Yes.
