Daniel Miner Gordon (1845-1925)

To the Graduates of Queen's.

A deputation from the University recently waited upon the Premier of Ontario and his Cabinet to present the claims of Queen's for assistance from the Provincial Treasury. They met with a very courteous and encouraging reception from Sir James Whitney and his colleagues, and came away from the interview with confidence that the Government regard the work of Queen's with appreciation and sympathy.

It is desirable that the members of the Legislature of Ontario should be familiar with the claims of the University for Provincial assistance, and it is fitting that these claims should be presented to them, where practicable, by some of their own constituents. The graduates of Queen's are therefore requested to bring the interests of the University to the attention of their representatives or friends in the Provincial Legislature, as well as to the notice of the press and other exponents of public opinion, as it is believed that the more familiar these are with the work and requirements of the University, the more readily will they promote any favourable action on the part of the Government.

Enclosed is a brief statement of some of the reasons presented to the Government on which the claims of Queen's may be supported.
