

B Y E - L A W

To regulate the Fees payable to Township Collectors, in the District of London.

[PASSED 12th February, 1846.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to regulate the Fees payable to Township Collectors for their services : *It is therefore hereby enacted* by the Council of the London District, held by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act of this Province, intituled, "An Act to provide for the better internal government of that part of this Province which formerly constituted the Province of Upper Canada, by the establishment of local or municipal authorities therein," That it shall be lawful for every Township Collector to reserve for himself the following fees, and no more, as a compensation for his services, for this and for each and every year hereafter, in collecting all rates and assessments, with the exception of the School tax, viz. : If the assessment of the Township for which he is Collector, with the exception of the School tax, does not amount to Fifty pounds, he shall retain a sum equal to Six pounds for every Hundred pounds he collects; if above Fifty pounds, and under One Hundred pounds, a sum equal to Five pounds and Ten shillings for every Hundred pounds; if above one Hundred pounds, and under One Hundred and Fifty pounds, a sum equal to Five pounds and Five shillings for every Hundred pounds; if above One Hundred and Fifty Pounds, and under Two Hundred pounds, a sum equal to Five Pounds for every Hundred pounds; if above Two Hundred pounds, and under Two Hundred and Fifty pounds, a sum equal to Four pounds and Ten shillings for every Hundred Pounds; and for all sums over Two Hundred and Fifty pounds, a sum equal to Three pounds for every Hundred pounds.
