W. H. Ballard, M. A., inspector. For school purposes the city is divided into five districts, in each of which there is a district school. Over each district is placed a head master, who has supervision, not only of his own school, but also of the primary schools attached to the central school of the district.

District I, or Queen's school district, includes that part of the city south of King and east of James; head master, 'W. C. Morton.

District II. or Central school district, includes that part of the city south of King and west of James; head master, G. W. Johnson.

District III, or Hess street district, includes Ward 4; head mastsr, A. S. Cruickshank.

District IV, or Cannon street district, includes Wards 5 and 6; head master, T L Kinrade.

District V, or Victoria school district, includes Ward 7; head master, John Ross.

There are 15 schools, 130 teachers, and a regular attendance of between 6,000 and 7,000 pupils.

There is a Kindergarten in each of the five districts.
