### Synopsis of Canadian North-West.

### HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

A NY even-numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, and Alberta, excepting 8 and 25, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 15 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

or leas.

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy, may, however, be made at any Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother, or sister of an intending homesteader.

DUTIES.—(1) At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by a stem of the solely by the solely living with father or mother, on certain conditions. Joint ownership in land will not meet this results must be solely living with father or mother, on certain conditions. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement. quirement.

(3) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the Love while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must notify the agent for the district of such intention.
