On motion of Mr. Young, *resolved,* that a Committee be appointed to enquire into the expediency of settling by Law, the Currency of the Province, and of introducing any new enactments; touching the Paper Money now in circulation, with power to send for persons and papers, and to report by Bill or otherwise, during the present Session. Committee on Currency and Paper Money

*Ordered,* That Mr. Young, Mr. Huntington, Mr. Bell, Mr. Fairbanks, and Mr. Holmes, be a Committee for the foregoing purpose.

Mr. Morton reported from the Committee to whom was referred the Bill to amend, consolidate, and reduce into one Act, the several Acts relating to the Summary Trial of Actions, before Justices of the Peace, for the recovery of Debts; that the Committee had considered the said Bill, and had prepared several amendments thereto, which they have directed him to report to the House, with a recommendation, that such amendments shall be adopted, and form part of the Bill; and he thereupon delivered the Bill and amendments in at the Clerk's Table. *Ordered,* That the Bill and Amendments do lie on the Table, and that the Bill be read a second time, with the amendments, at a future day.

On motion, the Order of the Day for considering the Bill for the appointment of Trustees of School Lands in this Province, in a Committee of the whole House, on Bills committed, was read; and thereupon, Order of Day Trustees of School Lands Bill extended

*Ordered,* That this House will, on Monday next, resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House on the consideration of Bills committed, and will therein take the said Bill into consideration.

A Petition of Francis Beattie and John Maxwell, Overseers of the Poor for the Township of Pictou, was presented by Mr. Dickson and read, praying reimbursement of certain expenses by them incurred, for the support and removal of Transient Paupers. Petition from Overseers of Poor at Pictou

*Ordered,* That the Petition do lie on the Table.

A Bill for making Lands and Tenements liable to the payment of Debts, and to repeal the Acts now in force, was read a second time. Lands' Bill read 2d time and committed

*Ordered,* That the Bill be committed to a Committee of the whole House.
