A Message from His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor was delivered by the Honorable Mr. Chandler, a Member of Her Majesty's Executive Council.

A Bill to authorize the Justices of the Peace for the County of Charlotte, to make further provision for the payment of the Treasurer of that County.

The said Bills were severally read a first time.

Ordered, That the said Bills severally stand for a second reading to-morrow.

The Honorable Mr. Wyer, by leave, presented the following Petitions:—

A Petition from William M'Kinney and one hundred and sixty other persons, inhabitants of the Parishes of West Isles and Campo Bello, praying no Law may be allowed to pass to interfere with the rights of Wier privileges as at present by Law established:

A Petition from Samuel Abbot and John Wilson, inhabitants of Charlotte County, praying relief in consideration of the forfeiture of the amount paid by them as a first instalment on the purchase of Crown Lands in the year 1835: and

A Petition from Flora M'Kenzie, of the County of Charlotte, praying an allowance for teaching a School in that County for one year, ending the 15th March, 1843.

ORDERED, That the said Petitions be received and lie on the Table.
