THE CROW'S NEST LINE.

So far Kootenay has good reason to be dissatisfied with the conduct of the Canadian Pacific Railway company in the matter of the construction of the Crow's Nest Pass line. That corporation most distinctly caused the impression to be given abroad that it intended to build the line and to build it this year. It is now nearly the middle of May and as no practical steps looking to the construction of the line have been taken we are forced to the conclusion that nothing will be done this year. Should the company now determine to go ahead with the work it will be too late to accomplish anything material and for another season at least East Kootenay will have to depend on such means of transportation as it has enjoyed in the past.

This delay on the part of the Canadian Pacific railway constitutes a distinct breach of faith on its part, and will entail not only a great loss on the people of Canada and Kootenay in particular, but it will result in large losses to great number of individuals and companies who are thronging into East Kootenay or sending representatives

THE MINER has from the first favored the government ownership of the Crow's Nest Pass railway, but realizing the impossibility of the construction of the line this year by the government and relying on the statement of the C. P. R. officials, and more especial y that of the president in his annual report, we took the position that the government would be justified in permitting the C. P. R. to construct the Crow's Nest line, provided the construction was begun at once and the C. P. R. surrendered the monopoly clauses in its charter and thus enabled the government to exercise a proper control over the freight and passenger

As the C. P. By its inaction East Kootenay has been dealt a severe blow. The immigrants who are setting into that country now can hardly remain there this winter without that railroad communication which they were promised, and what we predicted early in the season will come to pass. The tide of immigration which is now pouring into East Kootenay to the great advantage of Canada, will ebb as fast as it flowed, and above claim in another year it may be impossible to bring back to Canada those immigrants who will be driven out of it this winter for lack of railroad communication. The C. P. R. has needlessly exposed Canada to the risk of losing thousands of desirable immigrants, and this fact should be borne in mind in all future negotiations.
