**Imperia GERMAN PEOPLE DELUDED**

Starving Teutons Told Fantastic Tales of Distress Among Allies

By Courier Leased Wire.

The Hague, Tuesday, April 17. via London, April 18.—How urgent is the yearning for peace among the German people and how great is the increased strain just imposed on them in consequence of the reduction in the bread ration may be judged from the exhortations and the pictures of woe alternatives published in provincial newspapers on the inauguration of the curtailment of bread supply. The Courier of Hanover, for example, represents that quicker but unsatisfactory peace would not lead to a better food supply. The people are told that Great Britain, France, Italy and even the United States are reckoning with world famine for a current year and in case of a premature conclusion of peace, the demands of these countries for their own needs would prevent the supplying of Germany with foreign food stuffs.

The Courier portrays the British people as paying the highest grain price in the world, and declares that the Germans are situated more favorably than those who planned to starve them, not being menaced by a bad world crop and rapidly sinking tonnage. It, however, blocks the side of Germany should succeed through lack of economy, the newspaper says, "our people would have not only a time of bitter hunger, but a long period of the lowest wages and the most painful enfeeblement. Then, while France, Italy and Russia carried off Alsace-Lorraine, Trieste, Trentino, Constantinople and big Austro-Hungarian provinces at the price of victory, Great Britain would undertake the long planned annexation of our economic riches for our entire laboring population. We must therefore muster all our strength, clench our teeth and, remembering the sacrifices and sufferings of our men folk in the field, hold out and take up this new sacrifice."

**BRITISH GAIN NEAR ST. QUENTIN**

Village of Villers-Gaillain Captured From the Enemy

By Courier Leased Wire.

London, April 18.—The British forces have made further progress north of St. Quentin and have captured the village of Villers-Gaillain from the enemy. An official statement given out by the war office to-day.

Three men were instantly killed and nine injured in the fall of an elevator at the Goodyear Rubber Co. plant at Akron, Ohio. Thousands of acres of growing wheat in Oklahoma and Kansas threatened by a continued drought, have been saved by heavy rains.
