PROHIBITION BILL LAW ON JUNE 30TH.

The Legislative Council, After Divisions on Amendments, Passes the Bill by a Vote of 12-5

Halifax, April 19—After four divisions had been taken on as many amendments, resulting in 12-5. Bill No. 10, making Halifax a "dry" city, was passed by the legislative council yesterday afternoon. The debate on the amendments proved quite lively, and after they were lost the Bill was passed without further objection by the same vote. The messenger did not take this Bill to the House of Assembly. This will be done today, and no further amendments can be made to it. The Bill will become effective on and after June 30th.

\$1,450 for Stamp Donated by King George

London, April 4—King George, who is a devoted philatelist, recently gave the gem of his stamp collection to an auction sale of stamps in aid of the Red Cross. It is a 9d stamp of 1865, unused and very rare. It was sold to a collector for £280 (\$1,450.)

Canon Powell Passes Away

Word arrived this week of the death in Philadelphia of Canon Powell who last year resigned the presidency of Kings College after a most successful tenure of five years. Canon Powell was one of the most forceful speakers ever heard in Nova Scotia.

A cable message has been received in Shelburne from Jaboticabal, Brazil, announcing the death in that place on March 31st of Mrs. Jane A. Herries Locke, widow of Mr. E. Locke, of the firm of J. & E. Locke, Lockport.

Pure Milk and Meat Products

A special meeting of the Kentville Board of Trade was held on Tuesday evening last and there was a good attendance. President Blair opened the meeting calling the attention to the need of more care in the production and marketing of milk and meat products. He explained how great care was taken at the Experimental Farm in both lines and the milk was made as pure as possible and the animals were examined every six months and the tuberculosis test used. He introduced Prof. Townsend of Truro who gave a most interesting talk on the necessity of keeping our milk supply pure. He explained how contamination could take place and the necessity of each town having an inspector to visit dairies and slaughter houses, to see that sanitary regulations were carried out. Short addresses were also given by Messrs. Dr. Webster, Councillors R. H. Lamont and F. B. Newcombe, Truman Bishop, Wm. Yould, Dr. Burns, H. G. Harris, B. Webster, etc., and the necessity for carrying into effect the valuable suggestions of Dr. Townsend was emphasized. A hearty vote of thanks was given Dr. Townsend for his address.

Von Papen Indicted By United States Federal Grand Jury

New York, April 17—Captain Franz Von Papen recalled German military attaché at Washington was today indicted by the federal grand jury in connection with the alleged plot to blow up the Welland Canal in September 1914.

Over a Million Armenians Slain in Massacres.

Amsterdam, via London, April 16—Telegraphing from Cologne the correspondent of the Tjld says:

"Catholic ecclesiastical authorities in Germany have received from an authoritative source in the Catholic mission trust-worthy information that more than one million Armenians have been murdered by Turks through starvation or ill treatment. About 100,000 Catholic were among them, including four bishops.

The message concludes: "Popular feeling among the Armenians was roused against the Turks by the British."
