THE THREE BY-LAWS.

Brantfordites with their usual good sense, carried two money by-laws, which should have been carried and negated a hydra headed referendum regarding the Market Square, which didn't amount to shucks. The \$15,000 voted for the improvement of the Waterworks will mean direct pressure, keep down the fire insurance rates, and what is of very great importance, give the residents of the Terrace Hill district, a sufficient and continuous supply. This is something they have never

yet had, although paying on the entirely fictitious assumption that they did. In Mr. Fred Frank, the efficient Secretary, the city has a most excellent official and so also in Mr. Webster, the head of the pumping station and a succession of commissioners. This paper at first fought single handed for municipal ownership of that plant as against private ownership by a U. S. firm. Our exceedingly esteemed cotem. up street, was at first for the private control of the enterprise, but later switched. However that incident is of no consequence. The main feature is the fact that in addition to paying sinking fund and interest on the investment the works have turned about \$150,000 into the city treasury, and that too, with charges far lower than the average.

The \$15,000 for additional dyke improvements, was fully warranted. Many times fifteen thousand dollars worth of damage would be caused should the Grand River ever again invade West Brantford and Eagle Place districts.

Now as to the removal of the Market Square buncombe. This paper has for years fought that nonsense, and it is glad that the quietus has finally been given to the selection of some other place—a project in some cases dictated for personal reasons.

3—That the present square be suitably covered and the produce be kept from the fly brigade and other pernicious influences.

201 JEWS GET ONE YEAR WHOLESALE FRAUD

MOSCOW, Jan. 7.—An interesting trial involving fruitists' certificates with obtaining doctors' certificates, was brought to close here yesterday, when two hundred and one Jewish dentists were sent to prison for a year.


Some time recently it was discovered that many Jews in this city had become dentists by some underground means, and an investigation was made. For years previous the Jews could obtain certificates of dentistry by serving a required apprenticeship, but this system was revised by making it necessary to obtain a diploma from the Moscow University.

The Jews who held certificates could reside outside the pale, and the new requirement seriously threatened their chance of gaining the right. Diplomas being necessary, the scheme of fraud was then inaugurated, by which Jews could obtain certificates dating before the requirement of a diploma became necessary, but they over-reached themselves, and the fraud was uncovered.

Many arrests were made, and a total of five hundred Jewish dentists and those who aided them were accused. This number was reduced, but two hundred and eighty of the Jewish dentists were arraigned in court yesterday.

It took but a short time to convict two hundred and one of the number, and the sentence of a year's imprisonment was imposed. The others were acquitted. Nine physicians and officials were given sentences ranging from one to three years for procuring the bogus certificates for the Jews.

A DENIAL

As to the Formation of an Alleged Combination—Story Said to be Fabrication.

NEW YORK, Jan. 7.—A London cable says: In reference to the revival of the rumor contained in New York dispatches that a combination of the Cunard and Peninsular and Oriental lines is in process of formation, the Times says:

"We have the highest authority for stating that the story is an absolute fabrication. It will be remembered that in the autumn a reciprocal arrangement was entered into by the two companies whereby the Cunard became the agent of the Peninsular and Oriental in the United States and the Peninsular and Oriental became the agent for the Cunard in the Far east. This fact was recently brought out in Peninsular and Oriental official publications, and to it may not improbably be attributed the origin of this latest of many rumors.

"It is possible also that observers may have tried to deduce much from the fact that F. H. Cunard is a director of both companies, but we understand that Mr. Cunard has had a seat on the board of the Peninsular and Oriental Company for many years in his private capacity.


