# TROOPS FIGHT REBELS

Resulted in Victory of Chinese Government Forces.

Leader and Flags Were Captured-Over Hundred Men Are Killed-Gunboat Sent to Disaffected Places With Additional Troops-Swatow May Be Attacked - Famine Now Broken-Milk Supplied to Babes.

Canton, China, May 31.—A severe engagement has occurred between the provincial troops and a body of rebels, resulting in a victory for the former. The rebels lost over a hundred men killed and the Government forces captured the rebel leader.

Two thousand additional troops have been despatched to Chaochow.

The Chinese gunboat, Sum Hong, having on board the fifteenth regiment of Chinese troops, has sailed from here for Swatow, to defend that city against a possible attack on the part of the rebels.

Chinese Famine Ended.

Shanghai, May 31.—The famine which has prevailed for many weeks, causing hundreds of deaths and great suffering, has been broken.

The crops are still thin, but the hot weather of the past month has been favorable to a good yield.

American gifts have supplied milk regularly to 1,000 babies at the Hsu Cheo Fu Temple, while 200 more have been nourished occasionally. The children are left with their parents or relations, as the Chinese dread foreign orphanages.

LAFLAMME EMPHASISÈS. Insists That Article Published Was
True.

Quebec, May 31.—Judge Bosse yesterday having ruled against the evidence offered to prove Baron Lepine's incapacity as a witness, all his testimony was allowed to stand and Laflamme spent all the afternoon addressing the jury for the defence.

He claimed Asselin's article in Le Nationalist was fully justified by evidence which showed that as charged, Prevost sold mining permits privately and lands as well Thus one other paid \$1,000 for 200 acres, which he sold for \$100,000.

McKenzie had bought land for a few thousand, which he sold to a company with a capital of six millions, and declined to say how much he made out of it. He had been favored by being given permits fraudulently, which had been previously applied for.

"I have known men to serve time in penitentiary," said Mr. Laflamme, "for less offences."

He said that the mining department had been proved to be thoroughly demoralized.

COBALT LICENSE SWINDLE.

Two Men Asked \$3,000 for Government
Campaign Fund.
Toronto, May 31.—The provincial
detectives have unearthed what they
believe to be the beginning of a gigantic swindle in the sale of bogus
liquor licenses in Cobalt.
Two men were arrested Monday. A
man'called Enright was taken into
custody by Chief Caulback of Cobalt,
and another, Davison, of Ottawa, was
arrested there, charged with conspiracy to defraud.

It is alleged that these men went
to Cobalt and undertook in at least
one instance to procure a liquor li-

one instance to procure a liquor li-cense for a Cobalt man in considera-tion of \$3,000, which should go to the Provincial Government's campaign

fund.

They are said to have represented themselves as the fountain-head of influence, and to be able to produce dicenses at the given figure.

Davison is being sent to Cobalt, and the twain will appear there before Police Magistrate Brown this morning for a hearing.

PERILS OF BALLOONING.

Two Military Experts Carried Out to Sea—Are Rescued.

London, May 31.—A military bal-doon, piloted by Lieuts. Caulfield and Leake of the Royal Enginees, which was sent up from Aldershot camp. May 28 during the review in hon of Frince Fushimi of Japan, was picked up at sea by a fishing smack yesterday morning, some distance from Exmouth County of Devon, at the mouth of the Exe, in the English Channel.

Later in the day a despatch by wirsless telegraphy was received from the coast guard station at Scilly Islanda reporting that the two lieutenants had reached the station in safety.


Many Bank Bills Lest/
